## **Calaveras Public Utility District to Postpone**

## Hearing on Proposed Water Rate Increase

**SAN ANDREAS, Calif. – June 7, 2019 -** The Calaveras Public Utility District (<u>www.cpud.org</u>) is postponing its planned June 11, 2019 public hearing regarding proposed water rate increases.

The District received a letter from the Howard Jarvis Taxpayer's Association asserting that the District did not give proper notice of the planned hearing. The District disagrees with this assertion; however, in order to avoid the costs of defending the District against potential litigation, the Board of Directors has elected to postpone the hearing.

At its June 11, 2019 meeting, the Board will set a new date for the hearing. The District will mail notice of the new hearing at least forty-five days prior to the new hearing date.

Our intent is that any protest or written testimony sent to the District in connection with the originally noticed June 11, 2019 hearing will be a part of the record of the new public hearing.

## About the Calaveras Public Utility District

The Calaveras Public Utility District, formed in 1934, pumps over 450 million gallons of water yearly to approximately 2,000 customers in the 35 square-mile District serving nearly 5,000 people. The District's treatment plant filters and chlorinates the Mokelumne River water, which is gravity fed to San Andreas, Mokelumne Hill, Glencoe, Paloma, and Rail Road Flat.
