NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Calaveras Public Utility District Proposed Water Rates TUESDAY, AUGUST 13TH 2019, 7:00 P.M.

San Andreas Town Hall 24 Church Hill Road San Andreas, CA 95249

As you may be aware, the Calaveras Public Utility District Board of Directors was scheduled to hold a public hearing on June 11, 2019 regarding the adoption of a proposed increase to the District's water rates. That hearing has been rescheduled to Tuesday, August 13th at 7 p.m. at the San Andreas Town Hall located at 24 Church Hill Road in San Andreas.

The proposed rates are the same as were previously noticed for the June 11, 2019 hearing.

Any letters or written documents that were submitted to the District in connection with the June 11, 2019 public hearing will be entered into the record of the new hearing. Any protests submitted to the District in connection with the June 11, 2019 public hearing will be tabulated as if they were submitted in connection with the August 13, 2019 hearing.

REASON FOR THE PROPOSAL

The District charges water rates in order to fund expenses associated with operating, maintaining, and improving the water system that provides reliable, high-quality, water service to our approximately 4,500 customers.

The District's rates have not changed since the start of Fiscal Year 2015/16. System costs increase each year, not only due to the effects of inflation, but also due to the additional expenses associated with maintaining an aging system; modernizing system components; and meeting federal and state mandates for water quality testing and treatment. Current rates are not sufficient to fund all expenses and improvements.

The proposed rates are supported by a Cost of Service Study prepared by Weber, Ghio & Associates, Inc. The Cost of Service Study, as well as additional information supporting the proposal, is available online at the District website (www.cpud.org), and in person at the District Office located at 506 W. Saint Charles Street, San Andreas, CA 95249.

If adopted, the proposed rates will go into effect on August 13, 2019 and will be reflected on the billing cycle beginning August 26, 2019. Rates will further adjust annually, according to the included schedule, effective each July 1, beginning July 1, 2020 and ending July 1, 2023.

PUBLIC HEARING

The District will accept written protests against the proposed rate increase. A maximum of one written protest will be counted per parcel. Any written protest must include:

- A statement that it is a protest against the proposed charge;
- The name of the parcel owner or tenant that is submitting the protest;
- The original signature and legibly printed name of the person submitting the protest; and
- Identification of assessor's parcel number, street address, or utility account number of the parcel with respect to which the protest is made.

Written protests must be submitted by mail or in person to: Calaveras Public Utility District, P.O. Box 666, 506 W. Saint Charles Street, San Andreas, CA 95249. Communications submitted via e-mail or other electronic means will **not** qualify as a written protest.

Written protests may also be submitted at the public hearing. All written protests must be received by the District prior to the conclusion of the public comment portion of the public hearing. At the public hearing, the Board of Directors will accept and consider all written protests and hear all oral and written comments to the proposed rate increases. Oral comments at the public hearing will not qualify as formal protests unless accompanied by a written protest that complies with the requirements above.

On June 18, 2019, the Board of Directors adopted its Resolution No. 2019-8. The District will tabulate protests as set forth in that Resolution. This Resolution includes more specific language than the previously operative rules with respect to the submission of protests by tenants.

Following the conclusion of the public hearing, the Board of Directors will consider the adoption of the proposed five-year rate plan, which will take effect on the schedule described in this notice. The Board will not adopt the proposal if written protests are received with respect to a majority of parcels subject to the new rates (50% plus 1). Any further rate increase beyond those shown would require an additional public hearing.

PROPOSED RATES

The District's water rates are billed on a monthly basis. They are comprised of two components: (1) a base rate; and (2) a usage charge. Each customer pays a monthly base rate. For most customers, this rate is based on the size of their water meters. If multiple dwelling units or commercial units share a single meter, the base rate is based on the average water use per unit. A certain amount of water consumption, as shown in the included tables, is included in the base rate.

The usage charge is a charge for water consumption beyond the consumption included in the base rate. This charge is based on metered water consumption. Current and proposed rates are shown in the included tables. If, as the result of a drought, the District activates its 3-stage Mandatory Water Conservation Plan, the usage charge will be subject to a surcharge as shown in the Water Supply Shortage Surcharge table. Rates are designed to ensure that each customer pays for the costs associated with providing their service. Reference is made to the Cost of Service Study for additional details.
